From the Agronomy Desk...

What a year so far! With planting season just about over and the haying season just getting started, it's time to scout fields and assess stands of corn and soybeans and to check for pest problems in the hay stands. We have seen a great deal of fields with the Alfalfa Weevils in them this spring. Tissue sampling is available and is an effective way to make sure plants are getting the needed nutrients.

Alfalfa stands that are a little weak should be watched for stem rot and other diseases as they recover from the first cutting; they can take a toll on weaker stands. We do have a good supply of early day grain seed corn and longer day seed corn for silage if

needed. With the spring season starting early, things will be at differing stages of growth which can extend the window of opportunity for problems to arise. Heading into the summer growing season, keep an eye on your crops so that we can head off any potential problems. Additional weed flushes and extended insect feedings are the two primary vectors that we need to watch for. We will be out checking fields on a regular basis and if you think you may have a problem give us a call.

Thank you all again for your business and we look forward to checking in on you through the summer months.


